NIGERIA	Yes		Implementation date 30 Sep 2004. In the absence of IPPC stamp and treatment certificate the consignment then should be accompanied with Phytosanitary certificate

TURKEY	Yes		Deferred the date of implementation to 1 January 2006. The wood packing material should be debarked and either heat treated or fumigated with MB and marked in accordance with ISPM-15.
