

# ATP, NTUC FairPrice Jointly Organise Workshop on Import and Sale of Processed Food

Agrifood Technologies Pte Ltd (ATP) was appointed by NTUC FairPrice to organise a workshop on the control of import and sale of processed food on 7 November 2007. Targetted at the NTUC Fair Price suppliers, the objective of the workshop was to increase the suppliers' awareness on the Agri-Food and Veterinary Authority's (AVA's) regulations governing the import and sale of processed food in Singapore.

The workshop attracted interest from 57 supply companies, comprising food importers, distributors and manufacturers and 31 staff from NTUC FairPrice. Participants benefited from the comprehensive presentations on AVA's regulatory controls on the import and sale of processed food by AVA experts. The topics covered included: (i) Control of Imported Processed Food; (ii) Labelling & Advertisement; (iii) Food Recall System; and (iv) Post Market Surveillance.



The workshop received positive feedback from both NTUC FairPrice and the participants. NTUC FairPrice, in particular, is keen to run the workshop on a regular basis to educate its suppliers in ensuring compliance with AVA's regulations on the import and sale of processed food.
