



## **MEDIA UPDATE ON VEGETABLE SUPPLY SITUATION IN SINGAPORE**

### **Supply of Vegetables**

Singapore's supply of vegetables remained normal. From 3 pm yesterday to 3 pm today, 552 tonnes of fresh vegetables were imported from Malaysia,. This is 13% more than the normal volume of vegetables imported before the closure of Pasir Panjang Wholesale Centre (PPWC). There were 188 approved suppliers of Malaysian vegetables to Singapore.

2 There continued to be active trading of vegetables at the secondary distribution sites at Toa Payoh and Eunos. Last night, 25 stalls were operating at Toa Payoh, and 10 stalls were operating at Eunos.

### **Situation at the Causeway**

3 AVA cleared 252 vehicles at the Woodlands checkpoint bringing in 552 tonnes of vegetables and 448 tonnes of fruits. Six vehicles were turned back: one was not on the approved list of suppliers while the other 5 had been to PPWC.

### **SARS screening arrangements at PPWC**

4 AVA would like to reiterate that SARS screening will be carried out on all people entering PPWC at 3 SARS screening stations when PPWC re-opens on 5 May at 12.01 am. The location map of the SARS screening stations and the SARS declaration forms can be downloaded from AVA's website:
