**OUTBREAK OF AVIAN INFLUENZA (AI) IN NÆSTVED MUNICIPALITY,
DENMARK**

Denmark has reported an outbreak of H7 low pathogenic notifiable avian influenza (LPNAI) at a farm in Fuglebjerg, Næstved municipality in Denmark.

In view of the outbreak, AVA is imposing a temporary restriction on the importation of poultry and poultry products from Denmark to a 1 km restricted area around the affected premises, with immediate effect. For the import of poultry from unaffected areas in Denmark, additional certification is required on the veterinary health certificate as listed on Annex 1. Heat-processed poultry products which meet the requirements for heat inactivation of AI virus will not be affected.

AVA has also suspended all commercial import of live ornamental birds from Denmark.

Annex 1

The Veterinary Health Certificate accompanying the import of poultry and poultry products from Denmark should state that:

- i) The birds from which the meat was sourced were not vaccinated against Notifiable (H5 and H7) subtypes of avian influenza (NAI), as defined by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE).
- ii) The poultry meat and meat products were not derived from birds originating from the 1 km restricted area.
- iii) There have been no outbreaks of HPNAI involving commercial poultry in the country of origin in the six months prior to slaughter.
- iv) The poultry from which the meat was derived were born, raised, and slaughtered in Denmark, or were legally imported as day old chicks from countries with equivalent poultry health status.
